1. Introduction

The Macarthur Centre for Sustainable Living (MCSL, the Centre) is a not-for-profit, community-focused organisation that aspires to be a world-class educational facility and model for the promotion of sustainable technology and practices in homes, urban precincts and businesses. The Centre aims to display and demonstrate alternative energy production and use, waste-water recycling, water and energy efficiency, waste avoidance and green space management. The Centre conducts community educational programs and projects that build social capacity and empower individuals to embrace sustainable lifestyles.

2. Background

In 2004, the Royal Botanic Gardens & Domain Trust (the Trust) joined forces with CERES Macarthur, an environmentally committed group of Macarthur residents with the support of local councils and MACROC (Macarthur Regional Organisation of Councils), to form a new company called the Macarthur Centre for Sustainable Living. The Board of Directors was composed of three CERES members and three Trust members. With funding (approximately \$1.8 million) from the Australian Government's Sustainable Regions Program, the Centre was built and demonstrates the best in environmental design and construction. The funds were primarily for construction costs but covered staff costs until the end of the grant. A Memorandum of Understanding was signed between the landowner (the Trust) and MCSL which included a property lease of 5.3 hectares for four years with the option to renew for another four years. The Centre was officially opened on Tuesday 20 February 2007. A series of grants were secured to enable the Centre to employ staff to run the Centre while communicating sustainability education. CERES Macarthur ceased to exist in 2009 and Campbelltown City Council took the lead in setting up a three council (Campbelltown City, Camden and Wollondilly Council) group to partner with the Trust to ensure continuity of the Centre.

Volunteer support of community members, Councils and the Trust has kept the Centre alive and recent funding injections for a limited period has enabled a new Board of Directors (made up of three representatives each from the Councils and the Trust) to appoint a full



time Coordinator/Centre Manager with the necessary administrative, training and management skills to significantly turn around the profile of MCSL. The Board conducted its AGM on 8 December 2010 and meets monthly to consider future directions.

A Business Plan for 2011 was drawn up, a strategic direction set for next four years and the Mission Statement revised.

3. Current Status of MCSL

While Campbelltown City Council remains the most significant financial contributor to the operations of the Centre, the other two Councils have provided or are committed to providing further funding. With this financial involvement of the three LGAs and the growth of the Centre's own income streams the future for MCSL is in a much stronger position to fulfil its new mission. Public attendance at the Centre now averages 820 per month with ongoing community workshops general visitors dropping in for advice, increased number of school visits and increased use of the Centre's facilities by community and business groups for planning days and meetings. Volunteer numbers have increased to 22 and together with TAFE and school students, a number of new beds have been developed and constructed within the community garden. Lawns are being mowed regularly and the nursery and general plantings are being maintained. Walking paths have been enhanced, the existing cottage has been repainted (and computer networked), administrative systems improved and the Centre fitted with soft furnishings. The Centre Manager also fulfilled the Centre's grant obligations to a major Urban Sustainability Project for the Macarthur Region which ran for 2007-2011 and employed key support staff and re-established many meaningful relationships for future partnerships.

In 2012 & 2013 steps were taken to improve signage and interpretation, media coverage and on-line promotion. MCSL Board members, employees and volunteers enhance the visitor experience and effectively and efficiently communicate key messages to the whole community – to real and virtual visitors.



These key messages assist to promote the wider learning opportunities; increase visitor numbers and raise awareness of the organisation, its revenue streams and community engagement.

2014 is the year of progress; the Centre is consolidating its educational program, providing training to the community where ever possible e.g. in Schools, Child Care Centres, Housing Development Areas such as Oran Park or holding Tours at the Centre. The School Holiday program is running well and averages 400 students and 60 teachers each holiday. The Little Explorers playgroup has approximately 44-47 parents, Children, Bubs and Grandparents attending weekly, Children are loving the gardening activities plus learning about our local environment. The Centre now conducts group Tours with Devonshire Teas or Lunch, sustainable Venue hire and attends Expo's and Shows with our Kids Interactive Tent.

4. Scope and purpose of MCSL

A well run organisation has a clearly articulated mission, vision and strategic direction which are understood by all who are involved with it. It has also worked out what key messages it wants to convey to visitors and the wider community and how best to achieve this.

4.1 The mission, vision and objectives of MCSL

Organisational Mission:

To develop MCSL into a regional place of excellence that inspires the community to embrace an environmental conscience.

Organisational Vision:

The Board of Directors and staff of MCSL are committed to:

- Adopting and promoting best practice in environmental sustainability
- Conducting our business ethically, honestly and transparently



- Providing value for sponsors' and supporters' investments
- Fulfilling our duty of care to employees, volunteers and the public.

Organisational Objectives:

- As part of its business plan, the Board of Directors determined that:
- MCSL will encourage the community to adopt sustainable lifestyle choices to make a positive difference to the environmental sustainability of the Macarthur Region and beyond.
- MCSL will provide an attractive place of environmental excellence where visitors will see sustainability in action; have access to experts and plenty of opportunities to develop their own knowledge, interests and understanding.
- MCSL will develop strong partnerships with business and community-based stakeholders to secure MCSL's financial independence and future existence.
- MCSL will provide value-for-money to funding bodies to maintain MCSL's credibility and their respect.
- MCSL will continually review and improve its administrative systems to ensure a stable administrative foundation on which to build the Centre's operations.

4.2 New visitor objectives

The following objectives have been identified based on seven years existence of MCSL as a public place conducting numerous public programs and evaluations.

MCSL stakeholders and visitors to the Centre expect and deserve the following:

- An enjoyable outing where their needs for safety, comfort, orientation, information, recreation and education are met.
- Easy access to MCSL facilities and expertise, collections, messages and values.
- An experience that raises awareness of a wide range of sustainable technology and practices in homes, urban precincts and businesses – from the latest and the most sophisticated to the simplest but effective techniques for conserving earth's resources.



- An experience that engages and delivers satisfaction and empowerment to adopt sustainable living practices.
- An experience that fosters community interest and ownership of MCSL: the organisation and the Centre.
- An experience that is worth telling others about; that spreads MCSL's messages, programs and services 'well beyond the Centre boundaries'.

Future of MCSL

The Centre continues to flourish under the financial assistance of the Campbelltown City Council, Camden Council and Wollondilly Shire Council. Without this assistance, the Centre would not be able to assist the Local Community plus visitors from all over NSW. Since the filming and airing of the Sydney Weekender Program on the Macarthur Centre for Sustainable Living, visitors are dropping in looking for information, workshops or ideas on sustainable living and practices that can introduce into their daily lives.

From here the Centre has approval to erect a Windcore Turbine, the first in Australia to assist with educational training needs of TAFE and University Students plus a weekly farmers market.
